There is no registration fee and everybody is welcome.



By flight

from Cristoforo Colombo Airport

Volabus: it is a bus service to/from the airport. One-way tickets cost 6 euros. The bus stops at Genova Piazza Principe Railroad Station (5-minute walk from the conference venue).

Taxi: the cost is about 25 euros.

By train
